This 21st Century Community Learning Center program was authorized under Title IV, Part B and No Child Left Behind. The purpose of this program is to help establish local community learning centers that will provide academic enrichment opportunities for the children of KISD to:

- meet state and local student standard in core academic subjects
- offer students a broad array of enrichment activities that can complement their regular academic programs
- offer literacy and other educational services to the families of participating children

In June of 2014, KISD was awarded the 21st Century Community Partnership grant to provide an after school program to the students and families of KISD. The mission of this program is to provide a safe, drug-free, after-school learning environment that:

- is open to the community
- will foster parent and volunteer participation
- builds citizens of the future
- complement the students' regular academic program
- will provide a range of high-quality services to support student learning and development

This program offers

- Tutoring and mentoring
- Homework help
- Academic enrichment (such as hands-on science or technology programs)
- Enrichment activities such as: cheerleading, gardening, chess, basketball, cooking, technology, and MANY MORE!!
- Additional services such as: youth development, character education program, financial literacy.

POLICIES

Accidents/Incidents

If an accident occurs while a child is attending the program, the staff will assess the injury and take appropriate action. First aid boxes are kept at the site to deal with minor scrapes, cuts and bruises. If a more serious injury occurs which requires medical attention, 911 will be called and the parent will be notified. An accident/incident report will be prepared and a copy will be sent to the parent.

Attendance

Because each of our enrichment programs is curriculum based, it is vital that the children enrolled attend every day.

The Karnack ACE staff recognizes that there are situations that arise that would cause a student to be picked up early from the program. Early pick up from the program is discouraged. Regular attendance is vital.

If a student becomes ill in the regular school day and leaves school, the student will **not be allowed** to return to Karnack ACE that day. The student must attend the regular school day to participate in the afterschool program.

Our intention is to be sure every child who wants to attend the program has the opportunity. Therefore, if you have extenuating circumstances, please feel free to contact the Karnack ACE site coordinator on your campus.

Confidentiality

The 21st Century Community Partnership has provided a grant to fund our program. Our ACE staff will at all times protect the confidentiality of the families participating in our program. Any information received by our staff will be used only as necessary to adequately meet the 21st Century Community Partnership requirements. In addition, our staff will protect the confidentiality of our participating families by protecting any other privileged information gained through conversations and/or written documents.

Discipline

Children attending Karnack ACE Program will adhere to the discipline policy for the Karnack Independent School District students during the core day as contained in the Student Handbook and the Student Code of Conduct.

While our staff will make every effort to accommodate your child's needs, there may come a time when staff determines that the program will not be able to meet those needs. The Karnack ACE Program reserves the right to remove a child without use of the three steps listed below if the Campus Principal deems it appropriate.

Persistent or serious behavioral problems (physical violence, disrespectful attitudes toward staff, etc.) will be documented and the following actions will be taken:

- 1) 1st Offense verbal warning with write up sent to parent
- 2) 2nd Offense student is suspended from ACE until a conference with student and parent
- 3) 3rd Offense—student may be removed from the program

If deemed necessary, ACE staff may call to pick up the child for the day.

Hours of Operation

Programming is offered on all campuses Monday through Thursday. ACE will follow the same calendar as Karnack ISD. Each center hours are:

Karnack ACE: 3:15 – 6:15 PM

Transportation

Bus transportation will be provided for students in the after school program.

While students are on the bus after ACE programming they are under the supervision and discipline of the ACE staff. Children riding the bus under the Karnack ACE Program will adhere to the bus discipline policy for the KISD students during the core day as contained in the Student Handbook and the Student Code of Conduct.

Car riders MUST BE PICKED UP ON TIME!

Dress Code and Cell Phones

The dress code guidelines as outlined in the Student Code of Conduct will apply to the ACE program.

Campus day time cell phone policies apply to after school programming as well.

Medication

Medication will not be given during Karnack ACE Program.

Nutrition

A nutritious meal will be provided each day by Karnack ISD's Food Service Department.

If a child's diet must be modified for health reason, the parent must notify the center in writing and it must be included in the child's records. If a child's diet is modified for cultural reasons, the parent must notify the center in writing and may be asked to help provide supplemental foods.

Parent Involvement

The Karnack ACE Program is built on the philosophy that parents must be involved in the child's education. Therefore, we encourage all **parents or guardians to volunteer.** The Family Engagement Specialist and Site Coordinator will work with you to determine where and/or how you will serve. It is our goal to build a STRONG volunteer base for the continued sustainability of this program.

Parents may be also be asked to serve on the Karnack ACE Program Community Task Force to help guarantee a setting that will reflect the needs of today's families.

If parents have concerns or need assistance with problems related to the program, they may discuss the issue with the Site Coordinator. If they are not satisfied, they may discuss their concerns with the Project Director.

Social and educational events are held throughout the year to promote interaction between staff and families and you are encouraged to attend.

Karnack Independent School District Support

The Karnack ACE program will follow all rules and guidelines of Karnack Independent School District, the Karnack Independent School District Board of Trustees, and the federal and state guidelines of the 21st Century Community Partnership.
